Notably, she served as the Medical Exercise Evaluation Team Chief, where she was responsible for designing and conducting full-scale exercises, tabletop scenarios, and hands-on drills. These activities played a critical role in evaluating and enhancing the capabilities of specialized teams and disaster response force personnel.

Ms. Roberson is a proud U.S. Air Force Veteran, having commissioned in May 2010 as a Public Health Officer.
